Thunder Basin National Grassland has no developed campgrounds, and that might deter some campers, but there are many dispersed camping opportunities. A few specific locations, such as Salt Well Picnic Area and Gibson Draw, are described in ForestCamping.com with GPS coordinates provided. It is recommended campers obtain a free Motor Vehicle Use Map from Thunder Basin National Grassland's Douglas Ranger District office to get around in the grassland.

Perhaps better known for the massive coal mines on it's western boundary, Thunder Basin National Grassland provides the public a number of opportunities for recreation, including camping, hiking, sightseeing, hunting, off-highway riding, and fishing. It is a land that is a patchwork pattern of federal, state, and private lands, blending uses in ways to conserve and protect the land.

In addition to managing and developing the U.S. National Forest Campground Guide website, the Dows have also self-published <u>eBook</u> CDs and downloads of the U.S. National Forest Campground Guides. They are organized by geographic region, which can be purchased online at their website.
