

General Comments

The elevation is 2,100 ft.

There are four loops - A, B, C and D. Loop C has some sites adjacent to Lochsa River, which are open. The other loops are more heavily wooded with dense understory. In Loop C, most sites are shorter then in other loops, but wider. Bathrooms in Loops A, B and C have deep sinks for washing. Loop D is only for campers with horses and other stock. It has hitching rails, stock water, stock loading ramp and feeders. There is one trail outfitter at the campground; contact Lochsa Ranger District Office for information. The Lochsa River is popular in the spring for whitewater sports; contact Lochsa Ranger District for conditions and outfitters. Or, call the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Association on 208-342-1919. There are a number of river accesses near the campground along US Rt. 12. There is charred evidence of fire throughout campground. The campground is often visited by moose and other wildlife.
